## NARRATIVE DESCRTPTION

After 2 rounds, using acselerated pairings, only four players, $2,3,15$, and 18 had two points, while seven players, 1, 4, 16, 20, 23, 25,29 made up the $1 \frac{1}{2}$ point pool. Players $5,7,8,9,10,13,17,19,21,22,24,26$, 35 , and 33 had an even score 1-1.

After 3 rounds: Player 15 is the only 3-0 score which isn't bad for an 1881 rating, while 3 experts, an $A$ and a $B$ have $2 \frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$ (Players 1, 3, 4, 18, and 25). Still ahead of the game with 2-1 are players 2, 5, 7, 8, $10,13,19$, and 35 , while ranked with an even score are 16, 20, 23, 26, and 29. Casualties take their toll of $6,11,14,21,27$ who left the tournament after two rounds after losing one or more games. In the top games of the round, 25 beat 2,18 drew 3, in a reversal of expectations, while true to form 1 beat 20 , 4 beat 23, and 5 beat 25. Eventual Top C winner 29 (rating 1584) oversame a 434 point rating deficit to down player 5 (rating 2018).

After 4 rounds: $3 \frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$ is the highest score, shared now by players 1, 4, and 15. With 3-1 were players $3,7,8,10,13$, while $\pi i$ th $2 \frac{1}{2}-1 \frac{1}{2}$ only three players shared the spot namely, or, rather numerically, players 18, 23, and 25. With an even score were 2 (rating 2141), 5, $9,16,17,19,26,29,33$, and finally 35, with a rating of 1331 , a full 810 points lower than the 2 point pool leader.
At the finish: Veteran player 1 cames through with a win over 15, while 4 trips to 3 , to insure a decisive 1st place with $4 \frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$. With 4 points were players 3,8 who split 2nd and 3 rd. $3 \frac{1}{2}-1 \frac{1}{2}$ found players $4,7,10$, and 15 just out of the winners circle although 10 copped Top A. At $3-2$ we find $2,5,13,16,18,23,26,29$, the latter taking the Class C Trophy. 23 took B.

After 2 rounds, players 7, 8, 9, 11, 12, 26, 30, $31,32,37$, and 53 shared the unbeaten field with 2-0 with players 1 through 26 doing it the hard way playing eash other in the CCA's traditional accelerated pairings system. With $1 \frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$ after two runds were $5,19,28$, and with an even score $1-1$ were the top rated four players, 1, 2, 3, 4, as well as ordinary mortals, $13,16,18,20,22,23,24,25,27$, $29,34,35,36,38,40,41,43,44,47,48$, 49,50 , and 51. The big tour had lost to 8 , 9,12 , and 11 respectively in the 2nd round.

After 3 rounds: Perfect scores were achieved by five players, 7, 8, 9, 32, and 53. With $2 \frac{1}{2}$ points out of 3 were only two players, 19 and 37. With 2-1 scores were $1,3,4,5,11,12$, $18,20,25,26,30,31,34,38,40,44,47$, and 51. Three players 6,28 , and 48 had $1 \frac{1}{2}-1 \frac{1}{2}$.
Zventual $1 s t$ and 2nd pJ.ace winners beet hapless 30 (rating 1444) and 31 (rating 1439) as accelerated pairings reverted to normel.
Player 2 was still at a standstill even when paired against the second division as he lost to 34 , although his other friends 1,3 , and 4 rebounded with wins over 29, 35 , and 36 respectively. Only two players withdrew at this point, players 10 and 14. Booster players come to play chess, not to win prizes (I'm not sure this opinion is shared by all).

After 4 rounds: Player 8 defeats 53, the eventual top unrated winner, to stay in lst place with $4-0$. Close behind with $3 \frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$ are players 7, 9 (who drew each other), 32 (who drew eventual top $C$ winner 19). With 3-1 were ten players still capable of equalling 81 s score. These were 11, 12, 19, 20, 25, 30, 31, 37, 40 , and 53. Half of this group is from the second division, which proves something.

At the finish: Player 8 defeats player 7 to finish with $5-0$ to claim the jackpot and take it back to New York. Close behind with $4 \frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$ 2nd place money goes to player 9 of nonnecticut. 4-1 scores are achieved by players 11, 19, 20, 25 , 31 while $3 \frac{1}{2}-1 \frac{1}{2}$ was tallied by $1,3,6,7$, (the best scores of the top 7), 32 (who didn't even take TOD C trophy beceuse of 19 's 4 points. $3-2$ was scored by $12,16,18,23,30,33,34,37$, 40 (who won Top D), and 53 (who won Top Unrated). Seven players orcke even, 17, 24, 26, 45, 48, and 54. Only two more players withdrew on Sunday, 15 and $2^{27}$ who were having a poor tournament.

After 2 rounds, it was 3, 4, 6,10, 11, $\overline{20}$, and 26 with a perfect score from the top half accelerating pairings, 35 , $39,42,50$, and 54 also achieving 2 points from the lower half most of whom were unrateds. 47,48 , and 52 were next with $1 \frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$. All three drew with zero pointers from the top half in their second round, $12,19 \& 23$.

After 3 rounds : Players 3, 10, 35, 39, 50 and 54 held their flawless records intact, in the first interhalf pairings with the lower half winning 4 -1 while 3 beat 26 in the first half. 20 who had beaten 7 and 1 earlier surprisingly fell to 54 , a sleeper. Only 47 had $2 \frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$ while $1,2,4,6,8,11$, $13,15,18,20,26,27,38,42,43$ were $2-1$. Player 2 would eventually win top woman's prize. Others in this group would finish with 4-1 such as players $1,13,15$, enough to split third place money ( $\$ 20$ ) but not enough to win the 3rd place trophy. The only forfeit of the entire tournament took place in this round with 49 having another commitment, however he returned Sunday to finish his schedule.

After 4 rounds : Players 10,50 , and 54 still lead the field with $4-0$ downing their rivals. 39,3 , and 35 who were previously undefeated also. Since 10 is from out-ofstate (Tennessee) and 50 and 54 are unrated, it doesn't look too good for rated chess players in the metropolitan Washington DC area. Unrated 47 is next with $3 \frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$ beating top woman winner 2. With 3 points are 1 , $3,4,6,8,11,13,15,35,39$ and with $2 \frac{1}{2}$ points are 12, 22, 23, and 48. Still with an even score are 2, 7, 9, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 25 (who eventually won Top E), 26, 27, 31 (who eventually won Top Under 1000 when is USCF going to call it Class F?), 38, 40, 42, 43.

At the finish player 50 beat 10 for a 5-0 Ist place prize of $\$ 60+$ trophy while the other $4-U$ score, player 54 ,lost to 47 so that the latter won 2nd place ( $\$ 30+\mathrm{Tr}$. with a $4 \frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$ score. Player 10 took 3 rd on tie break with $4-1$ over players $1,13,15$, 35, 39 (who won top unrated) and 54 all of whom also had 4-1. Player 48 followed with $3 \frac{1}{2}-1 \frac{1}{2}$ while $2,3,4,6,8,9,11,12,17$, 20, 21 (who lost woman's trophy on tiebreak), 23, 38, 40 finished with 3-2. Six had an even score $2 \frac{1}{\frac{1}{2}}-2 \frac{1}{2}$, namely (or should I say numerically) 5, 7, 14, 22, 24 , and Top E winner 25. A good time was had by all !
